BOOKSTORE CLOSURE UNDER CONSIDERATION

Like many small shops the Kathaleen Cassidy Bookstore at St. Michael's has fallen on hard times. Sales, though never robust, have consistently declined, due in large part to competition from internet merchants who can sell merchandise at prices cheaper than the bookstore can acquire the same items. In addition, a number of suppliers, including Church Publishing, the main supplier of Episcopal items, have quit offering wholesale prices to small merchants like our bookstore.

As many of you know, Kathaleen Cassidy managed the bookstore for many years until her health declined. Nancy Larsen has managed the store in recent years, and she will be moving out-of-state this summer.

If there is a volunteer in the congregation who would like to take over management of the store, it may be able to continue for a while. However, eventual closure may be inevitable due to the factors mentioned above.

If you are interested in taking on this challenge, please let Nancy Larsen or Fr. Tom know. Otherwise, the bookstore is likely to close at the end of April. Stay tuned to hear more: either about a brave soul who has taken this challenge, or a going-out of business sale.

ANNUAL REPORTS

At the Annual Parish Meeting on Sunday, January 24th, it was noted that not all of the annual ministry reports had been published. Those reports are being published in this month's *Mike's Missal*. They will also be added as an addendum to the Annual Ministry Report. Following are those reports.

Knitters and Crocheters

The knitters and crocheters continue to meet Wednesday evenings at 6:30. We make prayer shawls, scarves for Special Olympics, caps for cancer patients, items for the Christmas at Sea program, baby caps in support of an anti-child abuse/shaken baby program, scarves for the Christmas dinner, and other items which support ministries at St. Michael's. Please join us. Instruction is available.

Book Sale

St. Michael's has semi-annual book sales, which support various ministries. The 2015 sales were the first Saturday in March and the last Saturday in August. Sales in 2016 are tentatively planned for March 5 and August 27.

Donations are accepted at any time and can be placed in the blue bin in the coat closet by the front entrance or in the choir room. We welcome donations of books, current magazines, DVDs, CDs, video tapes, books on tape, and vinyl records.

We earned over \$2400 last year (and more than \$10,000 since 2010) and this year's proceeds benefited the general choir fund, the Capital Campaign Fund, and the landscaping fund.

Cursillo

St. Michael's had three Cursillo candidates this year: Mark Camp, Carolyn Demps, and Suzanne Witzke. Sharon Vaz was on the team for the spring Cursillo.

Sharon Vaz holds a position on the governing board of the Oklahoma Cursillo Governing Board (the Secretariat).

The next English language weekend is April 22-24, 2016 (#132) at St. Crispin's. Another English language weekend is scheduled in August, 2016 and Lance Moody will be on the team. A Spanish language weekend will take place in the fall.

Cursillo is a movement of the Episcopal church. Its purpose is to help those in the church understand their individual callings to be Christian Leaders. The leadership may be exercised in work situations, in the family and social life, in leisure activities, and within the church environment. Leadership, in Cursillo, does not mean power over others, but influence on others; all of us need to be aware that we can exert a positive influence on those around us.

Wicked Women

Wicked Women meets on the third Friday evening of every month to share a meal that has been prepared by one of our members. The cost of the evening is \$10, but the first time is free.

This year, we expanded our boundaries and had two fundraisers for our Food for Friends fund at St. Michael's. Syra and Sharon Vaz prepared Indian food for the dinners and we raised over \$1000!

Spiritual Formation Annual Report

It has been said the spiritual journey is an inch wide and a mile deep. St. Michael's is a rich place for the deepening of our spiritual lives. In 2015 activities available included classes on Centering Prayer and Lectio Divina, Retreat in Daily Life (RIDL), Cursillo, and a Saturday morning Examen and Lectio group.

In the Spring and Fall of 2015, Wallace Ohl continued to lead the Lectio Divina group on Wednesday nights at St. Michael's. These groups are open to all who are interested and focus on reading and meditating on passages from the Bible. This unique approach to scripture nurtures a closer relationship between ourselves and the Word of God and is a powerful, fruitful way to pray. These groups continue to meet weekly.

The Retreat in Daily Life is a nine-month retreat based on the teachings of St. Ignatius of Loyola. St. Ignatius believed that our minds, particularly our imagination, are critical to our understanding and experience of the stories in the Bible and the life of Christ. By using our minds, we can connect with our hearts by spending time with the Word of God – literally bringing it to life within ourselves and listening to what God is telling us. This structured prayer adventure is nine months in length and retreatants meet regularly with a Spiritual Director, and commit to daily prayer and

journaling; there is also a weekly faith group where retreatants share their experiences. These groups begin every Fall and end a little after Easter every Spring.

Cursillo was offered in April of 2015. A weekend long retreat for confirmed Episcopalians aged 21 and older and intended to help Christians discover and live out their personal vocations in the world. Cursillo helps to renew and deepen Christian commitment and provides participants with a focus on movement and renewal, leading many to feel like newly made Christians with a purpose and with support.

In January 2015, the Episcopal Church Women (ECW) held their annual spiritual retreat at St. Crispin's. This retreat is open to women of all ages. Canon Susan Joplin of St. Paul's Cathedral led the spiritual activity this year. Because there is a cost associated with the weekend, ECW is pleased to offer scholarships to defray the cost of participation, and will hold another retreat in January 2016.

In the Fall of 2015, a Saturday morning Examen and Lectio group was established at St. Michael's. This group is a complementary group for any former RIDL retreatants, but is available for anyone who is interested to participate. Using the foundation of Centering Prayer, participants have opportunities to practice these skills using Lectio Divina, as well as use a weekly-focused Examen to develop their spiritual listening skills. Materials used in this course include Tomas Keating's teachings on centering prayer, daily readings from *Sacred Space*, the weekly Episcopal lectionary reading, and *Reimagining the Ignatian Examen: Fresh Ways to Pray form Your Day* by Mark E. Thibodeaux, SJ. This class will continue to meet in Spring of 2016 and is available to any who are interested.
