From Father Joseph

Therefore, following the holy fathers, we all with one accord teach men to acknowledge one and the same Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, at once complete in Godhead and complete in manhood, truly God and truly man . . . "

-- Council of Chalcedon, 451 AD, Act V

Christians proclaim two things about Jesus: First, that he was fully human, just like you and I; and second, that at the same time he was fully God. In Jesus, we see what humans would look like if our hearts were able to turn unerringly towards God. He came to show us the way so that we might become by adoption what He is by nature, Children of God. This Godward orientation is not something that can be achieved by effort, but only by love. Love always comes and must be received as a gift. We can never earn it. Although, through the effort of faithfulness we can make every effort to honor it and the goodness and wholeness it brings to our lives.

Few of us are able to turn our hearts unerringly towards God. We live in a broken world that desperately needs the love we have been given in order to heal itself. But we also live under the constant influence of that same broken and not very loving world, always working to draw our attention away from God. God understands our struggle, he "knoweth our frame; he remembereth that we are dust," and is gracious. (Ps 103:14) Thanks be to God, in Jesus we have both a teacher and guide to show us the way, an advocate to take up for us ("Father, forgive them, for they don't know what they do"), and a friend to walk with us and help us up when we fall.

Christians affirm that it is possible to have a relationship with Jesus, still, 2000 years after his ascension from this world. Jesus is, for us, "the ikon of the invisible God," the one in whom all that is knowable about God is made visible, human, and personal. Just as God's Wisdom became human in Jesus, when we make room for him, he "comes down from heaven" anew to dwell in our hearts. This cannot be proved by argument. But it can be experienced through the diligent practice of stillness, listening and prayer. One does not have to believe in order to pray. One comes to believe -- that is to say, to trust -- through faithful study, intentionally receiving Christ into ourselves in sacramental worship, and the faithful practice of prayer.

The Library Committee has completed a year of work in St. Mike's library. Stop in and read awhile in a comfy chair in the new reading nook.

Norman Coalition for Refugee Support

I have been very impressed with the organization and accomplishments of the Norman Coalition for Refugee Support, and I am so proud of St. Michael's for participating in this important ministry. Brent Smith is the Chair. Each of the seven participating churches in the Norman area are represented on the Board: First Christian, First Congregational, First Presbyterian, McFarlin, St. Michael's, and University Lutheran. At our May

meeting, the Board approved the addition of an eighth member, the largely Hispanic Tenth Man church.

The Coalition provides "wraparound" support for refugee families in the Norman area with the goal of eventual independence. The Coalition is currently sponsoring seven Afghan families and three from South America, including one each from Colombia, Guatemala, and Venezuela. We do not currently have the resources to take on additional families. We work along with Catholic Charities and a local resource, the SPERO Project.

The high cost of housing and the limited availability of Section 8 housing has been a problem. But the biggest problem most families face is a lack of facility in English, particularly amongst the wives and mothers. A new summer school language course, under the leadership of our own Amy and Jim Gardner, will take place this summer at Memorial Presbyterian.

There have been some notable successes in Coalition families. Two entering (Afghan) college students were approved for the Oklahoma Promise scholarship. Another Afghan student, interested in journalism, was awarded a master's degree in International Studies at OU this Spring. Primary level students are also succeeding. Two older elementary students plus all the kindergartners are working at a high enough level that summer school was not needed. All 5 of our eligible pre-K students were selected to attend full day pre-K next year. Several of the adult men now have jobs.

NCRS has need of volunteers, donations, and money. Volunteers are needed to provide transportation and function as liaisons with families. Handy persons can be needed to provide occasional repairs. Anyone wishing to volunteer can speak with me or Amy Gardner. Money will be used to pay for driving lessons, health insurance, immigration attorneys, utility deposits, and when necessary, rent. Current furniture needs include dining table and chairs and coffee table, desk and chair, and chest of drawers. Donations of used automobiles are also welcome.

The NCRF has included in their 2024 budget a \$ 1,000 donation from St. Michael's. They would

prefer if we, and other participating churches, could pledge donations. I don't know (since I am not on vestry) if we have already donated that amount or not. I believe we have the resources to do so, and I would love to see our congregation give generously to this worthy cause. Judy Phillips

Vestry at St. Michael's


