#### From Father Joseph

Not nearly enough people know this, but we Episcopalians were instrumental in making this nation what it is. Fifty-seven percent (57%) of the signers of the Declaration of Independence were Episcopalians (then known as "Anglicans"). Fifty-six percent (56%) of the men who drafted the US Constitution were Episcopalians. The United States as we know it would not exist, but for the Episcopal/Anglican Church.

But as we celebrate our freedom we should also remember, as St. Paul reminds the Galatians, we have not been set free in order to fall back into slavery to sin. Many have come to believe that "Well, I'm free; so I guess I can do whatever I want." But 'doing whatever you want" never makes anyone free. What really serves freedom -- ours and others' -- is what builds up community in love: the community of family, the community of the workplace, the community of the school, the community of the Holy Church of God.

Freedom is not found in endless sensual pleasures (not that pleasure is excluded; but it is properly a *consequence* of the right enjoyment of our freedom, not a goal in itself). Real freedom is about the gladness and wholeness of the heart, not the body. Any other understanding of freedom leads us into a slavery to pleasure and, in the end, misery of the heart.

We are called by Christ to serve a freedom that leads to human wholeness. The theologian, Mark McIntosh, writes about the real freedom that Christ gives us:

"... the early followers of Jesus ... reflect ... Jesus' strange freedom to entrust himself to the One he called Father, and (perhaps as a result of this freedom) .... It is this relationship, this entrusting of oneself to the divine Other, that seems to enable Jesus and his followers to live [freely] beyond the bitter constraints of fear and need for revenge.... In other words, it sets flowing within them and their community a new experience of abundance, of giving joy, of there being somehow 'enough,' such that one could trust this overruling goodness of God as the deepest truth of every situation."

The freedom that Christ gives us is 'enough'. It sets us free from the fear of death, from the slavery of selfishness, and leads us to the fruits of the Holy Spirit which Paul describes: Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. That is a freedom truly worth living for, and truly worth dying for, in the faith that the "overruling goodness of God" is the deepest truth of every situation, whether living for it or dying for it.

# Lectio Divina Wednesdays 6:30 p.m. in the Library

scriptures that leads us deeper into God's word. We slow down. We read a short passage more than once. We chew it over slowly and carefully. We savour it. #### **Norman Coalition for Refugee Support**

Judy Phillips is our new representative on the board and attended her first quarterly meeting of the Norman Coalition for Refugee Support. She was very impressed by this organization and its successes. One Afghan student just earned a Master's at OU; two Afghan high schoolers were approved for the Oklahoma Promise Scholarship.

Volunteers are needed for regular transportation, and to act as liaisons with families. Donations of furniture are welcome. Housing for large families in the present expensive market is a problem. Volunteers stress that the most significant barrier to family independence is the level of practical English language usage, particularly for women, who are often isolated. Consequently, the NCRS has embarked on a more comprehensive education program called "English Language Skills for a Healthy Community" to bring families closer to independence. Grants have been applied for, but even if those are awarded, we need an additional \$38,185. Contact Judy Phillips
