From Father Joseph The Task of Theology

Theology is, first and foremost, an attempt to integrate the head's knowledge ("I believe that I have a spouse") with the heart's knowledge ("I believe in my spouse"). It is this second kind of knowledge that gives our lives meaning. But it is the first kind of knowledge which leads us nearer to objective truth. Where objective truth (head knowledge) and faith (heart knowledge) are at odds, cognitive dissonance arises. The work of theology is to reconcile these differences.

Every human being engages in theology. Atheists reject the idea that creation has a Conscious and Loving Source. That is their theology. Jews and Muslims reject the idea of God as Trinity because their theological and linguistic/cultural frameworks do not permit it. That is their theology. I dare say, most of us engage in the work of theology every time we say the Creed. Although we often think the Creeds tell us what we should believe, most of us have to make sense of it for ourselves at some point, integrating our own reason and experience with our understanding of Scripture, and with a mind to the ways in which the broader traditions of the Church have understood it.

This is the "Three-Legged Stool" of Anglican/Episcopal theology: Scripture, tradition, and reason. Reconciling and integrating these three pillars of our Christian life -the teachings of scripture, the understanding of the larger tradition, and the experience of our own lives - is the work of theology. It is the work of every Christian.

- *Seek and you will find.
- *Knock and the door will be opened.
- *Discern/test the spirits, remembering that God is love, and that whoever abides in love abides in God, and God in him.

We have put together a financial audit team to prepare an annual report for the diocesan office. Members of the team are Jim Lanphere, Sachia Miller, and Howard Moore.

Deacon Ann's special project for her Iona project will be a Trivia Games night scheduled for Saturday, May 18th at 6:00 p.m. at St. Michael's. On May 14th, we will distribute flyers inviting members of the neighborhood to join us. This project fits in nicely with the long-range plans that came out of the vestry retreat. On April 28th, Fr. Joseph announced that Deacon Ann will be ordained to the priesthood in August at St. John's Tulsa. I asked her if she had a preferred title of address such as Rev. Ann Murray or Mother Ann Murray and she said no but would probably let the congregation decide.

One member of the congregation has expressed an interest in developing a support team for those of us who have special needs or have family members with special needs. The exact format has not yet been determined. I do believe respecting privacy and confidentiality should be part of this team's plans.

We need to update our Disaster Planning document to include how to respond to an active shooter situation, especially considering recent news. Our current team is Tina Mahle, Katie Blair and I. We are aware of the three basics: run, hide, fight but will be looking for diocesan guidance on completing this portion.
