From Father Joseph One of the most persistent heresies in the Christian Church is the idea that God is "out there," separate and apart from us. This is a very Greek idea of what God is. It is precisely the reason why Paul says that God's incarnation in Jesus and his crucifixion was "scandal to the Jews and folly to the Greeks." In the dominant Greek view, God was the source of the created world, but was far too perfect to have anything to do with this messy, nasty place.

The idea that God is outside the world, looking down upon it, but utterly separated from it persists. The common question "If there's a God, why is there so much suffering in the world?", generally supposes that God is separate from the creation and does not experience the sufferings of His/Her creatures. Moreover, it generally adopts the Greek view that God is a being, rather than Christian view that God is the Source of all being.

The dominant Jewish view also placed God outside of the created world; though, unlike the Greek view, He remained active in creation by means of His Word (Gr., *Logos*: the creative Self-expression of God's Wisdom) and Spirit. But to the Jewish view, the idea that God would incarnate as a normal human being and then permit Himself to be crucified was "scandalous."

The early Christians had a different understanding of God. At Mars Hill in Athens, Paul quoted a dissident Greek poet, Epimenides, to say that "we live and move and have our being *in* God." And in his letter to the Ephesians Paul, in an offhand comment, reiterates the idea that God is "above all things and through all things and in all things."

This is still a hard concept for us to grasp; but it lies at the very heart of what Christianity is about. Our God is never outside our struggles looking in; God is both outside and inside, sustaining and (when we permit it) redeeming the experience of the created world from within His creatures. Before Jesus was born, God's Logos (Word), says St. John, was already "in the world, and the world came to be through him, but the world did not know him." So, to make Himself knowable to us, He became incarnate as one of us, sharing the human experience from a humble birth to an unjust and torturous death. It is very easy to forget just how intimately present and involved God is in our lives. God shares in every experience, our joys, our sorrows, our victories, and our defeats.

From Senor Warden David Zittel As a parish, we have carried on despite the covid pandemic which is still not entirely over. While our congregation is getting older, I am delighted to see new younger faces joining us on Sundays for corporate worship. Live-streaming our services was a necessity during the pandemic but, in my mind, cannot replace in-person corporate worship, the coffee hour following the service, and many other parish gatherings. In looking over our annual report, I see the many outreach and community activities that we participate in. But I see the same names in charge of these activities and am mindful that we avoid burnout. We may want to concentrate on and excel at fewer activities and invite others to help lead, me included. I see many families with small children in my neighborhood off Berry and just north of Imhoff and would love to have them visit us and perhaps stay. I see us continuing our rainbow outreach and participating in Pride events. Equally compelling is the need to support immigrants, the unhoused / needy, and care for the environmental. And I see the need for a support group for those of us with ailing family members. I trust that through prayer and discussion we will discern our mission.

The luggage also contains a blanket and ageappropriate book or toy and a small personal hygiene kit. This luggage is delivered to the placement provider, often the same day as the request was placed. Flowering of the Cross 10:00 a.m.

As part of our Easter celebration, we will place flowers on a small cross that will be carried into the church and placed at the altar during the service. This is a fun event for kids, but adults are welcome to join. We will have cut flowers available to place on the cross and flowers from your home are wonderful additions and strongly encouraged. After the service the cross will be brought back into the gathering hall for people to remove the flowers and take them home.
