From Father Joseph Farber

This weekend, during our Patronal Feast of Michaelmas, St. Michael's celebrated 48 years as an outpost of the Kingdom of God in Norman. It was a marvelous gathering celebrating the lives and contributions of so many who have made this parish the beacon of God's welcome and love that it is in this community.

It has been said that Church is itself a sacrament. Church exists as an outward and visible sign of an inward and spiritual grace. In this case, the particular grace is the experience of a community of humans living in a state of reconciliation and love with one another and with God - a foretaste of the kingdom of God. This weekend we got to take a moment and simply enjoy it and celebrate how much St. Michael's has meant to the lives of so many through the decades.

Jan and I vividly remember the openness and welcome we experienced when we first came as lay folk to St. Mike's in 2002. At the time, we did not know how hungry we were for that kind of connection; but we were elated to have found it, and it continues to enrich our souls, hearts and minds on a daily basis. The welcome we experienced is part of St. Michael's DNA, and that is because lies at the heart of what it means to be a Christian: To know oneself - and all creation - as beloved of God.

At the same time, we celebrate God's love for us, we also readily acknowledge that we routinely fail "... to love You with our whole heart," and that we "... have not loved our neighbors as ourselves." At God's altar we contemplate and often experience the grace that we want to foster in the rest of our lives and in the world. The life of a saint is always aspirationally holy - not that we are necessarily accomplishing it, but we really want to. We go back into the world in the confidence that God sees us, not necessarily for what we are and what we do, but for who it is we truly desire to be - like Him. The Christian life, it turns out, is not (usually) a converted life, but a life of ongoing conversion as we aspire to grow into the likeness of Christ. We are nourished and guided in that conversion by the "Great Cloud of witnesses" that are God's saints -- namely, you. That is why Church is important and why it's important for each of us to be as active in it as circumstances allow - for ourselves and for one another.

From Senior Warden, David Zittel

I received from the diocesan office electronic Letters of Agreement (LOAs) for both Fr. Joseph and Mother Ann that define our mutual roles and responsibilities (job descriptions). The one for Fr. Joseph officially changes his title from Priest-in-Charge to Rector and the one for Mother Ann names her as a bi-vocational Associate Priest. Both positions will be part-time. The vestry were unanimous in approving the terms of both LOAs. Per the diocesan office's directive, we also approved amending the July vestry minutes to state that we are "calling" Fr. Joseph to be our Rector rather than simply asking for a title change. Once the diocesan office receives documentation, the diocesan office will send us LOA forms that can be signed electronically. Fr. Joseph's installation Celebration will be Thursday, November 7th at 6:30 p.m.

I believe we had a very successful Michaelmas/Homecoming Celebration on the 28th & 29th of this past month. We especially reached out to former church members both near and far. On Saturday the 28th we had a wonderful meal followed by a program of reminiscences about the formative years at St. Michael's and the addition of the education building with musical performances/skits blended in. We concluded the evening with a Compline Service. For the Sunday 11:00 am service on the 29th, we had two deacons, three priests, and a bishop leading the service! Thank you to all the volunteers who helped pull this together with special shout-outs to Evelyn Bibens for putting this together with help from Carol Zerboni, Nancy Littlejohn, Jon Roberts, Kathy Rodrigues, and Josh Yarbrough.



Stewardship Campaign - 2024 - 2025

Dear Parish Family,

This year's theme for our Stewardship Campaign is titled "Walk in Love." A stewardship campaign sometimes goes by other names such as "Every-member Canvass" or "Pledge Drive." However, I like "Stewardship" which, for me, seems most inclusive of the three "T's" – time, talent, and treasure. I see daily, weekly, and monthly, members of our parish family sharing the first two "T's": that is Time and Talent for such activities as for Laundry Love and Gay Pride events and for fellowship with the Saucy Sisters, Wise Women, and Wild-men's Night Out. (These are by no means a complete list of activities.) Each of these

gives us the opportunity to "Walk in Love." By this, I mean that we support both our parish family (in-reach) and those in the community (outreach). We listen sympathetically to problems members of our parish family may be experiencing while rejoicing in any good fortune that may come their way and we help those in the community who need our support without judgment.

Now to discuss the third "T", Treasure. Imagine how much harder it would be to carry out offering our gifts of time and talent without the physical structure of St. Michael's Church and space for our clergy and staff. This is why yearly, with occasional reminders and special requests, we ask for your financial support. We cover salaries for paid staff members and clergy, building and grounds maintenance, musicians, and miscellaneous expenses for office supplies, communications, and liturgical needs such as wafers and wine that are intrinsic to our worship service.

One additional thought about our church's physical presence. It provides us a common place for nourishing our spiritual growth. I appreciate hearing our clergy explaining / interpreting scripture in such a way that I can relate to it. Also, having sung in church choirs all my adult life, I appreciate our music that allows me to transcend the physical limitations of my earthly body as I seek to understand my purpose and being. Having a corporate service creates that wonderful environment.

You will soon receive a Pledge form in the mail or you may pick one up at church. Please consider prayerfully, and as you are able, make a financial commitment to St. Michael's so that we can continue to "Walk in Love" and grow spiritually.
